



JAN VAN DER HOEVEN (1801-1868)




Professor of natural history in Leiden Interested in physical anthropology Proponent of scientific racism

Private "Skull Collection" published in 1860 Catalogus Craniorum diversarium Gentium (included 210 ancestral remains)

Van der Hoeven's son sold the collection in a public auction in 1875 (around 330 ancestral remains in auction catalog)

ALGERIA (13 individuals)	Jean Louis Geneviève Guyon (1794-1870)	Corpses from hospital in Blida 1850/51
ANCIENT EGYPT (1 individual)	Thomas van Stolk (1826-1882)	"Souvenir" from a business trip
GHANA, GUINEA, BENIN (13 individuals)	Schelet / Schillet P. Neeb Krol Boomsma (probably Rintje Boomsma, born 1821) Carl Gobee (1804-1875) Cornelis Anthonijsz Swaving (1814–1881) Jacob Cornelis Broers (1795-1847)	Dutch-Ahanta War in 1838, Ahanta leader from same context as Ahanta king Badu Bonsu II "Ashanti Soldiers" in the Dutch East Indies Army, who died on Java (Indonesia)
CONGO REGION (2 individuals)	Dr. Klerk de Reeves	"James" died in hospital in Rotterdam in 1866
SOUTHERN AFRICA (19 individuals)	Francis Le Sueur Fleck (1821-1851) C. Biccard (probably Carl Wilhelm Thalman Biccard or Francois Louis Charles Biccard) H. (Henry?) van der Riet (born 1825?) C. Smuts (probably Dr. Cornelius Smuts) J. Smuts Jacob Petrus Roux	Victims of the '7th Xhosa War' of 1846/47 "Gifts" from former students at Leiden University, who came from the Cape Colony
TENERIFE (1 individual)	Davis, Joseph Barnard (1801-1881)	Still unknown
AFRICA (in general) (9 individuals)	Still unknown	Still unknown
COLOMBIA (4 individuals)	J. van Stolk, probably Jan van Stolk (1826-1880) Davis, Joseph Barnard (1801-1881)	Probably "Souvenir" from a business trip Still unknown
CHILE (1 individual)	Still unknown	"J. Santana" died 1870
SOUTH AMERICA (1 individual)	Antonín Frič (Anton Fritsch, 1832-1913)	Still unknown
